

USA Whole Yellow & Green Dry Peas

The green pea variety grown in this region has a light green seed coat and a dark green cotyledon (inside seed). Yellow peas are characterized by a light yellow seed coat and a deep yellow cotyledon. Whole green peas average 7.5-8.5 mm in size and weigh 18-19 grams per 100 seeds. Whole yellow peas are slightly larger in size than whole green peas, averaging 8.0-9.0 mm and weighing 20-21 grams per 100 seeds.

USA-grown Austrian Winter peas have a distinctive dark green (nearly black) seed coat and a yellow interior. The Austrian Winter Pea is smaller than the dry green pea, with a diameter of 4.5-5.5 mm and an average weight of 12-14 grams per 100 seeds. Chickpeas are light beige in color with a golden yellow interior. The common USA-grown dry chickpea, Kabuli, averages 8.5-10.5 mm in diameter and weighs .49 gram per 100 seeds. A smaller variety, Desi, averages 6.7-7.1 mm in diameter and weighs 15.8 grams per 100 seeds.

*USA Regular and Red Chief Lentils  
USA Crimson and Spanish Brown (Pardina) Lentils*

*Two varieties of USA lentils are grown for the export market; the U.S. regular Chilean-type lentil with its mottled or solid tan seed coat and yellow interior, and the popular Red Chief lentil with its light tan seed coat and pale orange interior. Regular lentils are commonly sold whole and unhulled, while Red Chiefs are commonly sold whole and hulled to reveal a reddish-orange interior.*

*Regular lentils average 5.0-6.0 mm in diameter weigh 6.5 grams per 100 seeds, while Red Chiefs are 6.0-6.5 mm in diameter and weigh 6.5 grams per 100 seeds. USA-grown Crimson lentils have a dark brown seed coat and a red cotyledon (inside seed). Crimson lentils are available with or without seedcoats. Smaller than regular lentils, Crimson lentils average 4.8 mm in diameter and weigh 4.0 grams per 100 seeds. Spanish Brown lentils have a dark brown seed coat and a yellow cotyledon. The average Spanish Brown lentil is 4.4 mm in diameter and weighs 4.0 grams per 100 seeds.*
